What Can NCPCA Membership Do For You?

Membership in NCPCA keeps professionals in close touch with industry events and activities.

Your membership is a deductible business expense - NCPCA is a non-profit state-wide association dedicated to improve the image of the pest control industry. You take your rightful place among the professionals and your membership fee is a valid income tax deduction.

Regional Workshops - Workshops are held throughout the state. Conducted by NCPCA's regional vice presidents, the regional meetings keep PCO's informed of industry activity which will affect the operation of their business. The regional meetings also provide members with an opportunity to offer suggestions and comments regarding NCPCA and its activities. Members enjoy a reduced registration fee.

Legislative Lobbying - NCPCA committees and a full-time lobbyist represent your interest in the law making process of North Carolina and provide a voice in Washington, D.C., on behalf of the association.

Pest Control Technicians' School - The PCT school is co-sponsored by NCPCA and NCSU Extension Service and offers technical training for the pest control industry. The PCT school is held annually in January.

The Tar Heel PCO - NCPCA's bi-monthly publication keeps members up-to-date with industry events, notices of meetings, new articles, technical information and other items of interest to the pest control industry. Information of an immediate nature is sent to you by a news alert.

Summer Meetings - Meetings are held with the South Carolina Pest Control Association in order to offer business management, education and technical courses to association members. It further provides an avenue for fellowship with other professionals engaged in similar work. These meetings rotate each summer between the sponsoring states.

Member Services - Members receive a membership directory, plaque and a "United We Stand" notebook.

Attorney - The NCPCA retains an attorney who attends board meetings and structural pest control committee meetings.

Executive Director - The NCPCA employs an executive director to oversee the day-to-day operations of the association.

Community Outreach - The NCPCA volunteers man hours and provides financial support to the Special Olympics of North Carolina.

Scholarships - The NCPCA awards two scholarships to qualified NCSU students each year.

Media Library - Members have access to video tapes, books, cassettes and cassettes with slides of training material for loan from the NCPCA Library.

Research Funding - The NCPCA contributes to the Indoor Entomology Fellowship at NCSU.

Committee Involvement - The association carries on many projects to serve the interest of the membership through functional committees, which study and recommend action. These committees provide advice, information and guidance in continuing education, insurance, public relations, scholarships, legislation and safety.
